Astros lead best-of-seven series 1-0)

Dallas Keuchel (KY'-kehl) dominated the Yankees again, striking out 10 in seven scoreless innings to lead the Houston Astros over New York 2-1 in the A-L Championship Series opener. He allowed four hits - all singles - walked one and joined Nolan Ryan and Mike Scott as the only Astros pitchers to reach double digits in strikeouts in a post-season game.

It was Calgary's 11th straight victory.
